



Portuguese Group of AIDP

Annual Report 2020

Pursuant to the By-Laws and the Internal Regulation of the Association, as well as to Article 10 (f) of the By-Laws of the Portuguese Group, it is hereby provided the annual report of the activities developed by this Group during the year of 2020.

Upon being founded by 12 members on the 30th of October 2019 (as acknowledged by the Association on the 17th of December of the same year), the Group started immediately to plan its expansion to further members and the creation of the Group of Young Penalists.

I

The Group co-organised with the Spanish Group of AIDP:

- The Conference “Criminal Policy in the face of a new legislature” / “A Política Criminal ante uma nova legislature” / “La Política Criminal antes una nueva legislature”; and
- The 1st International Seminar of Young Penalists of AIDP of the Portuguese and Spanish Groups “Criminal Policy and Criminal Law: The Proposals of a New Generation” / “Política Criminal e Dogmática Penal: As Propostas de uma Nova Geração” / “Política Criminal y Dogmática Penal: Las Propuestas de una Nueva Generación”;

both of which took place in Cádiz (and were broadcasted via the platform Blackboard) on the 16th and 17th of July 2020.

The organisation selected 10 papers (5 from each of National Group) to be published in the [Boletín Oficial del Estado](#), in articulation with AIDP’s series [RIDP libri](#). This should take place in December 2020 or January 2021.

II

The Portuguese Group, alone, organised the International Conference “Artificial Intelligence and Criminal Law” / “Inteligência Artificial e Direito Penal”, which took place at the Faculty of Law of the University of Coimbra (and was broadcasted via the platform Zoom) on the 20th of November 2020. The Programme of the Conference is hereby attached as Annex. The President of AIDP, Professor John Vervaele, opened the Conference, together with the President of the Portuguese Group of AIDP, Professor Anabela Miranda Rodrigues, and the President of the Institute for Legal Research of the Faculty of Law of the University of Coimbra, Professor Aroso Linhares. The Conference was steadily attended by circa 100 persons, and over a significant stretch of time by over 160 persons.

III

The Group has developed its own website, which can be accessed at www.aidp-pt.org, where the bodies, the members and the by-laws of the Group are provided, and the activities of the Group publicised. The website also contains a registration form for new members, and several requests for membership have already been received.
